The light disappeared to reveal three large blue blocks of ice standing around a fourth block of ice, that hung from a tree.

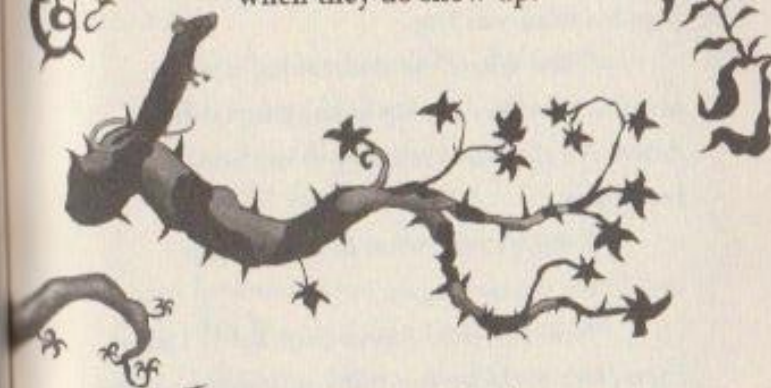
Inside the blocks of ice were the trolls, and, still spinning on the rope, a very surprised-looking Raven Boy.
