Year 1

What jobs do people do?

PSHE (Economic wellbeing: aspirations, work and career)

In this unit the children will:

- Understand that people have different strengths, and explore what their strengths might be
- Discuss some of the strengths and interests someone might need to do different jobs
- Understand that jobs help people to earn money to pay for things
- Learn about the different jobs that people they know or people who work in the community do

Key Vocabulary

- **strengths** - things that you do well and recognise that you are good at
- **job** - a task or piece of work, especially one that is paid for
- **career** – a job that you do for a period of time that has opportunities to progress
- **qualification** - an award you get for passing an exam or completing some learning
- **earn**- to receive money in return for work

Key Knowledge

That the people they know personally, or in the community, do lots of different jobs, and what some of those jobs might be.

That people earn money from doing jobs, and that they can use the money to pay for things. That some jobs earn more than others.

That you can choose a job based on your strengths and work at school or university to get qualifications for some jobs.

That a career is a job you do for a period of time in which you continue to learn and may take on responsibility.

That all jobs are important in a community/society.
